PROJECT



The two-story West Friendship Fire Station #3 is a 41,000 SF fire station in Sykesville, Howard County, Maryland. The station will house members of the volunteer department, including both fire and EMS personnel. The unusual v-shape design of the station separates the fire apparatus from the EMS apparatus with two separate wings. The fire wing will contain three drive-through apparatus bays and one drivethrough wash bay. The EMS wing will accommodate five back-in apparatus bays.


Principal-in-Charge of the project, Mark Stromdahl, believes that by separating the fire and EMS apparatus, we were able to make the most efficient use of space. Since

the back-in EMS bays are smaller than the fire bays, the space behind the EMS bays is used for the bunk areas. It will provide for sleeping quarters for 21 people, a feature that is designed to attract trained college students looking for free room and board and for those who want to volunteer as firefighters.

The two apparatus wings will connect with administrative space, which will accommodate offices, a full weight and exercise room, lounge room, activity room, and full kitchen/dining room.
